€ 40,00 per competitor in Intermediate/ Basic Novice, Debs and Cubs

If no judge is supplied by the National Federation of the skater, the registration fee per competitor will be **90,00 / 70,00 €**

In case of late payment, participation will be denied.

In case **of withdrawal after the deadline of entry** there will be no refunding of the entry fee.

Individual Results: The marking system (ISU Judging System) will be used in accordance with the respective ISU Communications.
The three best-placed skaters in each category will be announced and honored at the official Victory Ceremony. By registering for the competition, the skater agrees resp. the legal representative of the skater agree to the publishing of the results on the internet.

Media/Internet: Entry lists, results and photos of athletes are published on the internet. **With Competition Registration, the athlete or the athlete's legal representative agree to the publication of name, results and photos.**

Judges: Participating clubs or associations are asked to supply one judge per team with the minimum qualification "National championships" who is trained in the new ISU Judging System. Hotel costs for judges must be paid by the registering club or association. The organizer withholds the right to choose the panel of judges.

Music/ Planned Program: Only compact discs will be accepted. In accordance with Rule 343, § 1, all discs must show the name and nation of the skater, competition event, and the exact running time of the music (not skating time). All discs must be submitted at the time of registration. Each program (short program, free program) must be recorded on a separate disc. The discs

must function flawlessly. In addition, each skater must provide a back-up disc for each program.

If music information is not complete and discs are not provided, accreditation will not be given.

Together with the entry forms the "Program Content Sheet" must be handed to the Organizing committee.

It is mandatory that the "Program Content Sheet" is completed by each skater in English using the terminology listed in the respective ISU-Communications. It is not permitted to hand over the Program Content Sheet directly to the responsible officials.

1. GENERAL

The Heiko Fischer Trophy 2019 will be conducted in accordance with the ISU Constitution and General Regulations 2018, the ISU Special Regulations and Technical Rules Single & Pair Skating 2018, as well as with the relevant ISU Communications.

In case of a very high number of skaters in one category, the organizer withholds the right to form several divisions in one category.

The organizer also withholds the right to form groups of up to 8 participants in the categories Advanced Novice, Intermediate Novice, Basic Novice, Debs and Cubs (according ISU Com. 2172 (revised) if need arises.

According ISU Rule 513 the starting orders for Juniors and Advanced Novice Free Program will be in reverse order to the final result of the Short Programs.

2. CATEGORIES

JUNIOR Ladies and Men

The age requirements are in accordance with ISU-rule 108, § 3b

Short Program: The required elements to be skated are those listed in ISU Technical Rules Single & Pair Skating 2018 Rule 611, § 1 and 3 for **2018/19**

Duration: 2:40 min, +/- 10 sec for Ladies and Men

Free Skating: In accordance with ISU Special Regulations Technical Rules Single & Pair Skating 2018, Rule 612, § 1 and 2 and the respective ISU Communications. Special attention should be paid to the “well balanced program” and the element value.

Duration: Ladies: 3:30 min, +/- 10 sec
Men: 3:30 min, +/- 10 sec

ADVANCED NOVICE Girls and Boys

The age requirements are in accordance with ISU Communication 2172 (revised)

Specific explanations for Advanced Novice (in accordance with DFBest.DKBK/ 20.07.14):

There will be no further deduction by the technical panel for a fall after a fully rotated 2 A or triple jump (no < or << called).

For the rest of the falls, the ISU rule for novice competitions will be used.

Short Program: The required Elements to be skated are those listed in the ISU Communication 2172 (revised), § 2.3 and respective ISU Communications.

Duration: 2:20 min, +/- 10 sec for girls and boys

Free Skating: elements in accordance with ISU Communication 2172 (revised), §2.3 and respective ISU Communications. Special attention should be paid to the contents of a well balanced program and the element values.

Duration: 3:00 min, +/- 10 sec for girls and boys

Factors: in accordance with ISU Communication 2172 (revised), § 2.3 the factors of the components are

INTERMEDIATE NOVICE Girls and Boys

The age requirements are in accordance with ISU Communication 2172 (revised)

Free Skating only: Elements in accordance with those listed in ISU Communication 2172 (revised) §2.2 and respective ISU Communications. Special attention should be paid to the contents of a well balanced program and element value.

Duration: 3:00 min, +/- 10 sec for girls and boys

Factors: In accordance with ISU Communication 2172 (revised), § 2.2 the multiplying factors of the program components are

For girls	1,7
For boys	2,0

BASIC NOVICE Girls and Boys

The age requirements are in accordance with ISU Communication 2172 (revised)

Free Skating only: Elements in accordance with those listed in ISU Communication 2172 (revised) §2.1 and respective ISU Communications. Special attention should be paid to the contents of a well balanced program and element value.

Duration: 2:30 min, +/- 10 sec for girls and boys

Factors: In accordance with ISU Communication 2172 (revised), § 2.1 the multiplying factors of the program components are

For girls and boys 2,5

DEBS GIRLS & BOYS

The age requirements for **DEBS:** born after 1st of July 2007 and before 30th of June 2009

Duration: 3:00 min, +/- 10 sec for girls and boys

Free Skating only:

A well - balanced Free Skating Program for DEBS must contain:

a) Maximum of 6 jump elements for Girls and Boys, and one of which must be an Axel type jump. There may be up to two (2) jump combinations or sequences. A jump sequence consists of 2 (two) jumps of any number of revolutions, beginning with any jump, immediately followed by an Axel type jump with a direct step from the landing curve of the first jump to the take-off curve of the Axel jump. Jump combination can contain only two jumps.

Triple jumps are not permitted. Any single and double jump (including Double Axel) cannot be executed more than twice in total.

b) There must be a maximum of two (2) spins of a different nature (abbreviation), one of which must be a spin combination with or without change of foot (minimum of six (6) revolutions in total) and one spin in one position with or without change of foot (minimum of six (6) revolutions in total). Flying entry is in one spin **optional**.

c) There must be one (1) step sequence fully utilizing the ice surface.

The Program Components are only judged in

- Skating Skills
- Performance/Execution
- Interpretation

Factors: For girls and boys 1,7

Levels explanations: For DEBS in all elements that are subject to Levels, only features up to **Level 3** will be counted.

CUBS GIRLS & BOYS

The age requirements for **CUBS**: born after 1st of July 2008 and younger

Duration: 2:30 min, +/- 10 sec for girls and boys

Free Skating only:

A well - balanced Free Skating Program for CUBS must contain:

a) Maximum of 5 jump elements for Girls and Boys, and one of which must be an Axel type jump. There may be up to two (2) jump combinations or sequences. A jump sequence consists of 2 (two) jumps of any number of revolutions, beginning with any jump, immediately followed by an Axel type jump with a direct step from the landing curve of the first jump to the take-off curve of the Axel jump. Jump combination can contain only two jumps.

Triple jumps are not permitted. Any single and double jump (including Double Axel) cannot be executed more than twice in total.

b) There must be a maximum of two (2) spins of a different nature (abbreviation), one of which must be a spin combination with or without change of foot (minimum of six (6) revolutions in total) and one spin in one position with or without change of foot (minimum of six (6) revolutions in total). Flying entry is **not** allowed.

c) There must be one (1) step sequence. The step sequence will have a fixed Base value (StSqB) and evaluated in GOE only.

- Performance/Execution
- Interpretation

Levels explanations: For Cubs in all elements that are subject to Levels, only features up to **Level 2** will be counted.
